Title A Bill to Amend Title 1 Article 9 (Legislative Officer Selection and Duties) of the ASUC By-Laws

WHEREAS, the Associated Students of the University of California is an autonomous student government that exists to support all students on this campus; and

WHEREAS, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council (MCGC) was officially chartered at the University of California, Berkeley in February 2007

WHEREAS, the MCGC serves as the governing body for the culturally based fraternities and sororities at UC Berkeley

WHEREAS, the council's mission is to give prominence to the various heritages within the Greek Community

WHEREAS, the council strives to uphold a commitment to service, scholarship and the values of sisterhood and brotherhood while making a positive impact on campus

WHEREAS, MCGC is currently comprised of ten traditionally Asian American, Chicano/Latino, multicultural and religion-based chapters

WHEREAS, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council consists of 10 following Greek Chapters

Alpha Delta Phi

Gamma Zeta Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Lambda Theta Alpha Latin Sorority, Inc.

Lambda Theta Nu Sorority, Inc.

"9.28 Representative to the Multi-Cultural Greek Council

At least one (1) Senator shall be selected by the Senate to represent the Senate to the Multi-Cultural Greek Council at the Multi-Cultural Greek Council's regularly scheduled meetings."

WHEREAS, Students for Free Culture (SFC) at Berkeley is organizing the 2008 Students for Free Culture International Conference on Oct 11 – 12, 2008, demonstrating the unyielding confidence of SFC's international governing body for SFC at Berkeley, and

WHEREAS, the 1st annual International Conference has the following goals:

- 1) To establish a yearly touchstone event for the advancement of free culture issues.
- 2) To provide a networking opportunity and colloquium for free culture members and reform-minded partners.
- 3) To grow the free culture movement by defining a national agenda—and funding homegrown projects through donations.
- 4) To firmly establish a chapter at UC Berkeley where the intersection of technology and progressive politics finds a natural home.

WHEREAS, the International Conference provides UC Berkeley a unique opportunity to lead an international movement for free speech and proliferation of information, connecting UC Berkeley back to its famous 1960s roots,

WHEREAS, the International Conference features a wide variety of concept panels, keynote speaker by Professor of Law Lawrence Lessig (father of the Free Culture movement), and a setting for conference attendees to set the national agenda and build groups to address specific issues, and

WHEREAS, the International Conference will involve at least 36 universities all over the world and will be publicized to heavy-traffic websites (ex: Creative Commons Blog), social networks, fliers, etc, and

A Bill in Support Cal Community Music

WHEREAS, Cal Community Music’s (CCM) mission is to share the love of music to the wider community and to bond with community members through music, and
WHEREAS, CCM is the only active music-based community service student group at UC Berkeley as instrumentalists and vocalists of CCM plan tri-monthly concerts, and
WHEREAS, CCM, since its inception in 1983, has been dedicated to performing music at retirement homes, convalescent hospitals, and elementary schools (tutoring as well) in the Bay Area with approximately 10 venues; their commitment evokes such emotional gratitude as “music washes away...the dust of everyday living and it transports us to a world of beautiful harmonious melodies”, and
WHEREAS, CCM is indiscriminately open to students of all majors and backgrounds offering the Cal community a productive, exciting, and altruistic means of learning and performing music, and
WHEREAS, CCM’s role as a benefactor to the community was recognized by Cal Corps Public Service Center for the past two decades, and
WHEREAS, CCM historically does not involve itself in the ASUC’s Spring Budgeting process as CCM leaders anticipated renewal of Cal Corps sponsorship; moreover Cal Corps’ unexpected leadership transitioning in the Spring 2008 led to inconsistent communication with CCM in the application process and delayed notice of inability to sponsor CCM, and
WHEREAS, CCM’s innovative management allows the group to minimize transportation and accessory costs; however CCM spent into a deficit as a result of the Cal Corps’ miscommunication in Spring 2008 regarding an additional \$100 (one hundred USD), and
WHEREAS, CCM’s expenses and revenues and projected budget, as of September 5, 2008, is:

Office supplies: \$20

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the ASUC Senate recognize Business Careers in Entertainment Club as a first year SAG (Student Activities Group); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ASUC shall allocate \$130 (one hundred thirty dollars) from the Senate Contingency Fund to Business Careers in Entertainment Club.
