A Bill in Support of a Ban on the Use of Chalking in ASUC Elections

WHEREAS, chalking is an incredibly labor-intensive process which favors major-party candidates with significant campaign infrastructure, making it harder for small parties and independent candidates to compete; and

WHEREAS, as Auxiliary Director Permaul stated in his report on March 11, 2009, both the University and City have expressed concerns about the effects of chalking both on the environment and our relationship with the city of Berkeley; and

WHEREAS, the campus and city have expressed that they may pursue legal, campus and elections council options to make sure that perpetrators are punished; and

WHEREAS, there is nothing in the ASUC By-laws about the use of chalking during ASUC Elections; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Article IV Section 12.6 of the ASUC By-Laws be amended to add the following:

11. Using chalk, hairspray, any combination thereof, or any other material, to publicize any ASUC candidate or political party within the limits of the City of Berkeley on sidewalks or streets.

**A Bill in Condemnation of
Researcher Intimidation**

WHEREAS, In February 2009 four animal rights activists were arrested for allegedly threatening the personal safety of UC researchers; and

WHEREAS, UC spokesman Dan Mogulof, quoted in the February 27 Daily Californian article “Activists Charged with Threats to Researchers Appear in Court”, stated that there were 160 incidents of threats toward UC Berkeley campus researchers in the last 18 months; and

WHEREAS, The ASUC has made a point, at least since the November 13 Eshleman incident, to aid in the mediation of conflicts both on and off the Berkeley campus; and

WHEREAS, In August 2008 a small group of animal rights activists firebombed the residence and automobile of a UC Santa Cruz researcher; and

WHEREAS, The researcher’s family escaped from their burning home by means of a fire ladder from their second story window; and

WHEREAS, The ASUC calls for only nonviolent means to remedy this researcher-activist conflict; and therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the ASUC strongly condemn any act of violence, perpetrated or threatened, against any member of the UC community on account of his or her profession or political or ethical beliefs; and

RESOLVED, That the ASUC also call for transparency and openness with respect to the extent of animal research that occurs on the campus of UC Berkeley.

A Bill in Support of the UC Berkeley/City of Berkeley Sweatshop Worker Tour on April 7, 2009

Sponsored by Senators Tara Raffi and Kifah Shah**

WHEREAS, The City of Berkeley spends millions of dollars per year in public funds on goods, including garments, uniforms, materials and other equipment, and supplies and services provided by private vendors and manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, Both UC Berkeley students and Berkeley residents recognize a public interest in the City of Berkeley's need to avoid payments to vendors and contractors who maintain sweatshop working conditions, including below-subsistence wages, excessively long working hours, unhealthy and unsafe working environments, child, indentured, and prison labor, disregard for local and international labor laws and workplace regulations; disregard for fundamental women's rights, and repression of workers' rights to assemble and bargain collectively; and

WHEREAS, The passage of a strong, effective, and enforceable Sweatshop-Free Ordinance by the Berkeley City Council is the best way to ensure that the City of Berkeley makes its purchasing decisions in an ethical manner; and

WHEREAS, The passage of a strong, effective, and enforceable Sweatshop-Free Ordinance by the Berkeley City Council is the best way to ensure that the City of Berkeley makes its purchasing decisions in an ethical manner; and

WHEREAS, The goals of the UC Berkeley/City of Berkeley Sweatshop-Free Tour are to (1) promote awareness about sweatshop conditions in the global supply chain of goods and services; (2) educate students and members of the public on current steps that are being taken to combat the funding of sweatshop labor and on actions that they can take to maintain their awareness; and (3) garner support for passage of the Berkeley Sweatshop-Free Ordinance through the Berkeley City Council; and

WHEREAS, The inaugural event on the UC Berkeley campus will feature presentations by two former workers in the sweatshops of Puerto Rico and Honduras; discussions with two organizers from Sweatfree Communities, a nationwide sweatshop-free research and public advocacy group, on the context of the economic crisis and its effect on workers; a keynote by renowned labor and immigrations rights author David Bacon; and a musical interlude by the Berkeley Labor Chorus; and

WHEREAS, The staging of a portion of the National Sweatshop Workers Tour on the UC Berkeley campus underscores the emphasis that students and young people can play in ending taxpayer support for sweatshops on the local and university level; and

WHEREAS, The staging of a portion of the National Sweatshop Workers Tour on the UC Berkeley campus underscores the emphasis that students and young people can play in ending taxpayer support for sweatshops on the local and university level; and

WHEREAS, This event is expected to draw a minimum of 100 students and members of the public through targeted outreach to dozens of UC Berkeley student groups (including but not limited to Students for Social Change, Students Organizing for Justice in the Americas, and the Jewish Student Union) and over 30 Bay Area organizations, labor unions, and Berkeley City Council offices; and

WHEREAS, While event organizers are taking steps to seek additional contributions from ASUC grants and through public and private donations, the ability to raise a minimum of \$1000 on a zero-cost model or a minimum of \$1500 factoring in publicity and supplies will ensure that admission ticket costs are minimized or altogether eliminated

**A Bill to Create a Temporary Committee on the Revenue and
Expense Sharing Agreement Between the ASUC and the GA**

**Authored by Executive Vice President Pasco
Sponsored by Executive Vice President Pasco, Senator Zuo**

WHEREAS, graduate and undergraduate students comprise approximately one-third and two-thirds of the student population on the UC Berkeley campus, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the ASUC and the Graduate Assembly (GA) are the student government bodies on campus that serve their respective students' needs; and

WHEREAS, the ASUC commercial activities revenue has been relatively flat for the past ten years; and

WHEREAS, the residual commercial activities revenue returned to the ASUC student government was \$0 for fiscal year 2007-2008 and is projected to be \$0 for fiscal year 2008-2009; and

WHEREAS, it would bring about fiscal equity and financial responsibility for commercial activities revenue to be shared as equally and as fairly as student fees currently are; and

WHEREAS, the GA recognizes that a fair and equitable commercial activities revenue sharing agreement implies a responsibility to the fair and equal sharing of the fiscal burden from goods and services that mutually benefit the GA and the ASUC; and

WHEREAS, the sharing of expenses implies an equal distribution of authority and ownership over those expenses; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the "Temporary Committee on the Revenue and Expense Sharing Agreement Between the ASUC and the GA" be created; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the "Temporary Committee on the Revenue and Expense Sharing Agreement Between the ASUC and the GA" consist of the ASUC President, ASUC Executive Vice President, two (2) ASUC Senators nominated and approved by a two-thirds vote of the entire Senate, the GA President, one (1) other GA Representative, to be appointed by the Graduate Assembly and one (1) Student Representative to the Store Operations Board, to be appointed by the Store Operations Board.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the ASUC Finance Officer and the ASUC Auxiliary Director sit on the temporary committee as non-voting members.

**A Bill to Create a Temporary Committee on the Selection of
Student Representatives to the Store Operations Board**

WHEREAS, two undergraduate representatives shall serve on the Store Operations Board in overlapping, two-year terms; and

WHEREAS, these undergraduate representatives must be enrolled students at the University of California, Berkeley at all times throughout their terms; and

WHEREAS, both of the current undergraduate student representatives to the Store Operations Board will be graduating this semester; and

WHEREAS, the voice of students shall continue to have a strong voting presence on the Store Operations Board; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the “Temporary Committee on the Selection of Student Representatives to the Store Operations Board” be created; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the “Temporary Committee on the Selection of Student Representatives to the Store Operations Board” consist of the ASUC President, ASUC Executive Vice President, one (1) current undergraduate member of the Board (the outgoing member, if available) and two (2) ASUC Senators, nominated and approved by a two-thirds vote of the entire Senate, and who shall be non-voting members of the committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee publicize the openings by placing an ad in the ASUC’s weekly ad space in the Daily Californian for at least two (2) consecutive days; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this committee shall select and forward two (2) undergraduate nominations to the full Senate for approval by a two-thirds vote of the entire Senate.
